OLD BUSINESS:

RE MATTER: Special Events Update - Chief Henderson recognized Pete Springer for retrieving a student's cell phone during the Homecoming Event. The Homecoming event was held on Saturday and concluded without incident.

RE MATTER: Re-Establish Garage Fire Separation for New Residential Construction -Update – Nothing to report.

NEW BUSINESS:

RE MATTER: Traffic Calming – South Landing Road –A resident along South Landing Road has expressed concern regarding the speed of vehicles along the roadway. Speed humps were previously installed to control speeding. Speed data was obtained using Officer SMART in April of 2017 and recent data was obtained using a concealed traffic monitor. The data obtained by Officer Smart and the concealed meter was similar. Chief Henderson will share this data with the concerned resident. Additionally, The DPW is evaluating the cost of installing sidewalks along the entire length of South Landing Road.

The committee also discussed traffic calming alternatives for Warren Avenue.

RE MATTER: Cobetts Glen/Park Lane cul-de-sac parking restrictions – A resident was concerned that parking for the Cobetts Glen Park along the Park Lane cul-de-sac would obstruct emergency vehicles and requested that "No Parking" signs be posted along the Park Lane cul-de-sac. The Town Board will consider scheduling a public hearing at their second meeting in September.
