SUBCOMMITTEE REPORTS:

TOWN BOARD UPDATE – reported by Councilman Werner

Town Budget increase of approximately 4.5 % due to several factors including. rising insurance costs, will exceed the State Tax Cap. The installation of the sidewalk along East Avenue is underway thanks to support by State Senator Cooney. Town interviewing contractors to conduct commercial real estate assessments. After completion of the Quicklees Convenience Store at 12 Corners, the Town is considering a proposal for another store on East Avenue.

All Departments moving from the Town Hall to accommodate the planned renovations by 15 November 2024 to Empire State Campus on Westfall Road for the next 18 months..or so.

Pharmaceutical takeback conducted on 26 October and an electronic recycling and shredding event was held on 27 October 2024 at the Town of Brighton Highway Department on Elmwood Avenue.

CORBETT'S GLEN / HIGHLAND CROSSING TRAIL – reported by Ray Warrick

One of the park benches in the Corbett's Glen needs to have graffiti removed and repainted and there are trees blocking the Pond Trail at the Brighton Town Park that should be removed.

Ray enquired if the Town had ever considered using road millings for repaving projects as base for the town park trails as done in other towns (e.g. Henrietta).

This is a brief report regarding the main park areas & facilities. Other smaller public areas are tended to on a regular basis. We remain extremely busy with Park and Facility maintenance tasks, especially on trails. Seasonal facilities including athletic fields will be closed on November 1st. This will be our last week of mowing for the 2024 season.

TOWN PARK:

- All fire alarm inspections have been completed.
- Completed an extensive perimeter garbage pick-up off Sawgrass drive (non-park property)
- Preventative maintenance and tune ups on park equipment.
- Re-staining of park benches.
- The final nature trail cut back for the season.
- Preparing facilities for voting.
- Softball field maintenance.

PERSIMMONS PARK:

- General Park bi-weekly garbage cleanup and mow
- Fall Park cleanup.
- Vegetation growth cut back along South Clinton Ave.

MERIDIAN PARK:

- Baseball field maintenance – fields are being prepared for the end of the season. Brighton Little League ended on 10/26.
- All annual alarm and fire inspections have been completed.
- Continued trail maintenance.
- Athletic Fields will be aerated and over seeded once fields close for the season.
- We continue to work with Brighton Little League on various field maintenance requests.
- Garden cleanups.
- Park Benches and Tables re-stained.
- Continued equipment maintenance.
- Deer stand and Deer hunter monitoring.
- We hosted a large lacrosse tournament on October 13th.
- Seasonal Park bathrooms and athletic fields will close on November 1st.
- Canal Boat dock cleanup and vegetation cut back.
- We installed a second accessible ramp on the park walkways from the parking lot as part of an Eagle Scout Project.

BUCKLAND PARK:

- Preventative maintenance on all equipment is ongoing.
- All annual alarm inspections have been completed.
- Athletic field will be aerated and over seeded once athletic fields close. With the ramped-up field use in 2024 we will once again evaluate the need to rest a field in 2025.
- Baseball fields lip renovations and repair.
- Concession Building Beam replacement.
- Playground equipment maintenance.
- Park tree trimming.
- Storage barn reorganization.
- Seasonal bathrooms will be closed on November 1st.

- Concession Building fire system repairs.
- Outdoor bathroom plumbing repairs.
- Pedestrian trail bridge repairs.
- We have rebuilt a large portion of the park perimeter trail, which included digging out and replacing sections of trail.

SANDRA FRANKEL NATURE PARK/BRICKYARD TRAIL:

- Daily general park walkthrough
- Trail head garden cleanup is scheduled
- We teamed with the Friends of the Brickyard Trail to hold an invasive removal work day on Saturday 10/26. The focus was on the invasive Japanese Knotweed.

CORBETT'S GLEN:

- Ongoing landscape /trail maintenance to keep trails clear of debris.
- Scheduled Graffiti removal.
- Scheduled pedestrian bridge repair.
- Large Tree removal scheduled around the park lane area.

LEHIGH VALLEY TRAIL & THE HIGHLAND CROSSING TRAIL

- Final seasonal mowing and various tree limb and brush removal
- Replaced missing blind curve signage.
- Various additional boulder placement on LVT
- HCT Pedestrian bridge maintenance and debris clearing.

BUCKLAND FARMHOUSE/VETERANS MEMORIAL:

- All annual alarm inspections and building inspections
- Garden and walkway maintenance
- Fall Cleanup and cutback scheduled.
- Annual heating system maintenance.
- Investigating light outage issue at the Vets Memorial.

12 CORNERS TRIANGLE PARK:

- Irrigation line repair
- Utility box scheduled repaint.
- Weeding and garden cleanups.
- Seasonal irrigation system winterized.

BUCKLAND FARMERS MARKET BUILDING:

- All fire inspections have been completed.
- Building cleaning and program set ups
- Preparing for election day.

OTHER:

- We continue to identify capital improvement projects and maintenance equipment needs for the future.
- We have continued maintenance along the Auburn Trail within our easement requirements.
