Re: Allen's Creek Sewer Study RFP

Dear Councilperson Salzman and Committee Members:

The DPW will be preparing a Request for Proposals for consulting firms to provide proposals for an engineering study, design, construction recommendations, and bid package preparation for a section of the Allen's Creek Sanitary Sewer (from the Town line near Brookside Drive to the East Avenue crossing). This section of sewer has a history of maintenance issues and problems. This section of the sanitary sewer crosses under Allen's Creek and experiences inflow/infiltration issues due to Allen's Creek flow and groundwater. Multiple sanitary laterals are up to 20' deep and have shifted causing sink holes on the above roadway.

It is anticipated that the RFP can be awarded, a study provided with options, and a bid package prepared by the end of 2025. Currently, the 2025 Town budget has a line item of \$175,000 for this referenced RFPs proposal study and engineering. Construction inspection rates are requested as part of the RFP submittal and would be optional at the Town's determination after construction parameters and costs have been determined. Based on the engineer's estimate and recommendations, funding will need to be added to the 2026 budget for construction/repair costs and construction inspections services (if necessary). A contributing section of upstream sewer flows come into this sewer piping from the Town of Pittsford. A formula for cost sharing with the Town of Pittsford would be calculated and provided as part of this RFP proposal.

The DPW will be preparing a Request for Proposals for a consulting firm to provide services for surveying, planning, and engineering design for the Summer Farmers Market located at Buckland Park. Anticipated work needed for the summer market would involve a considerably larger gravel parking lot to accommodate the increased traffic as compared to the winter market, site lighting, the addition of a right turn lane onto Westfall Road, stormwater improvements, and expanded areas for vendors and food trucks.

It is anticipated that the need for providing the summer market improvements could be as soon as April 2026 due to school construction work at the current location. At this time, the Town is investigating avenues for procuring the necessary funds required to finance the survey, engineering, and ultimately the construction work required.

Dear Honorable Town Board Members:

As part of the 2025 through 2027 Town Capital Improvement Plan and the 2025 Adopted Town Budget, a Highway Plow Truck, Kubota Tractor and Roller/Compactor were identified for funding in 2025 through the issuance of bonds. I am recommending that the Town Board adopt a bond resolution as prepared by Bond Counsel totaling \$500,000 (the original estimate of these items was \$534,365) that will provide financing to purchase said equipment:

Bond Resolution totaling \$500,000 (Highway Equipment)

15 Year repayment period: Bond Resolution \$500,000

- 1.) Purchase One Highway Plow Truck - \$369,000
- 2.) Purchase One Highway Kubota Tractor - \$61,000
- 3.) Purchase One Highway/Parks Roller/Compactor - \$70,000

The bond resolution should be adopted at the March 12, 2025, Town Board Meeting. This bond has a repayment period of more than five years and for that reason is subject to permissive referendum. This resolution will require 2/3rds majority vote by our Town Board (four of the five members). After the permissive referendum and/or estoppel periods have passed, the borrowing process can be completed. This bond issue will be sold as a consolidated issue.

BOND RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF BRIGHTON, MONROE COUNTY, NEW YORK (THE “TOWN”), AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION OF MACHINERY AND APPARATUS FOR USE BY THE TOWN; STATING THE MAXIMUM ESTIMATED COST THEREOF IS \$500,000; APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT THEREFOR; AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF UP TO \$500,000 IN SERIAL BONDS OF THE TOWN TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION

WHEREAS, the Town Board (the “Board”) of the Town of Brighton, Monroe County, New York (the “Town”) proposes to authorize the issuance of \$500,000 in serial bonds of the Town to finance the acquisition of machinery and apparatus for use by the Town’s Highway Department (collectively, the “Project”), at an estimated maximum cost of \$500,000; and

WHEREAS, the Board now wishes to appropriate funds for the Project and to authorize the issuance of the Town’s serial bonds and bond anticipation notes to be issued to finance the aforementioned specific object or purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Town Board (the “Town Board”) of the Town of Brighton, Monroe County, New York (the “Town”) (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of such body), as follows:

SECTION 1. The Town is hereby authorized to undertake the acquisition of machinery and apparatus for use by the Town’s Highway Department consisting of (i) one (1) plow/salt truck, (ii) one roller, and (iii) one tractor. It is hereby determined that the maximum estimated cost of the aforementioned class of object or purpose is \$500,000, said amount is hereby appropriated therefor and the plan for the financing thereof shall consist of (i) the issuance of the \$500,000 in serial bonds of the Town (including statutory installment bonds) authorized to be issued pursuant to this resolution or bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such bonds and (ii) unless paid from other sources, the levy and collection of taxes on all taxable real property of the Town to pay the principal of such bonds or notes and the interest thereon as the same become due and payable.

SECTION 2. Serial bonds of the Town in the principal amount of \$500,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to provisions of Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (the “Law”) to finance the aforementioned class of object or purpose.

SECTION 3. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforementioned class of object or purpose is fifteen (15) years, pursuant to subdivision 28. of paragraph a. of Section 11.00 of the Law.

SECTION 4. The final maturity of the bonds herein authorized to be issued shall be in excess of five (5) years measured from the date of issuance of the first serial bond or bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this resolution.

SECTION 5. The temporary use of available funds of the Town, not immediately required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were borrowed, raised or otherwise created, is hereby authorized pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Law, for the capital purposes described in this resolution. The Town shall reimburse such expenditures with the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this resolution. This resolution shall constitute a declaration of official intent to reimburse the expenditures authorized herein with the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized herein, as required by United States Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 6. Each of the serial bonds authorized by this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said serial bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the Town, payable as to both principal and interest by a general tax upon all the real property within the Town subject to applicable statutory limits, if any. The faith and credit of the Town are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal and interest on said serial bonds and bond anticipation notes and provisions shall be made annually in the budget of the Town by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and bond anticipation notes to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

SECTION 7. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Law, pursuant to the provisions of Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of serial bonds and bond anticipation notes or the renewals of said obligations and of Sections 21.00, 50.00, 54.90, 56.00 through 60.00, 62.10 and 63.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Town Board relative to authorizing serial bonds and bond anticipation notes and prescribing terms, form and contents as to the sale and issuance of bonds herein authorized, including without limitation the determination of whether to issue bonds having substantially level or declining debt service and all matters related thereto, and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes, are hereby delegated to the Town Supervisor, as the chief fiscal officer of the Town (the "Town Supervisor"). Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents as may be prescribed by said Town Supervisor consistent with the provisions of Local Finance Law. Further, pursuant to paragraph b. of Section 11.00 of the Law, in the event that bonds to be issued for the class of object or purpose authorized by this resolution are combined for sale, pursuant to paragraph c. of Section 57.00 of the Law, with bonds to be issued for one or more object or purpose authorized by other resolutions of the Board, then the power of the Board to determine the "weighted average period of probable usefulness" (within the meaning of paragraph a. of Section 11.00 of the Law) for such combined objects or purposes is hereby delegated to the Town Supervisor, as the chief fiscal officer of the Town.

SECTION 8. The Town Supervisor is hereby further authorized to take such actions and execute such documents as may be necessary to ensure the continued status of the interest on the bonds authorized by this resolution and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, as excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes pursuant to Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and to designate the bonds authorized

by this resolution and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, if applicable, as “qualified tax-exempt bonds” in accordance with Section 265(b)(3)(B)(i) of the Code.

SECTION 9. The Town Supervisor is further authorized to enter into a continuing disclosure undertaking with or for the benefit of the initial purchasers of the bonds or notes authorized by this resolution in compliance with the provisions of Rule 15c2-12, promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

SECTION 10. The Town Board hereby determines that the actions authorized by this resolution and the adoption hereof collectively constitute a “Type II” action within the meaning of the State Environmental Quality Review Act and the regulations of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation thereunder (collectively, “SEQRA”) and that no further action under SEQRA need be taken by the Town Board as a condition precedent to the adoption of this resolution.

SECTION 11. The intent of this resolution is to give the Town Supervisor sufficient authority to execute those applications, agreements and instruments, or to do any similar acts necessary to affect the issuance of the aforesaid serial bonds or bond anticipation notes without resorting to further action of the Board.

SECTION 12. Pursuant to subdivision b. of Section 35.00 of the Law, this resolution is subject to a permissive referendum in the manner prescribed by Article 7 of the Town Law of the State of New York (the “Town Law”). The Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed, within ten (10) days after the date of adoption of this resolution, to publish and post a notice satisfying the requirements of Section 90 of the Town Law, which shall set forth the date of adoption of this resolution, shall contain an abstract hereof, and shall specify that this resolution was adopted subject to a permissive referendum. Such notice shall be published in the official newspaper of the Town for such purpose.

SECTION 13. This resolution shall take effect thirty (30) days after the date of its adoption or, if within such thirty (30) day period there is filed with the Town Clerk a petition subscribed and acknowledged by the number of qualified electors of the Town required by Section 91 of the Town Law and in the manner specified in such Section, until approved by the affirmative vote of a majority of such qualified electors voting on a proposition for its approval.

Set forth below is a summary of said resolution adopted by the Town Board of the Town of Brighton on March 12, 2025.

1. The resolution is entitled "BOND RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF BRIGHTON, MONROE COUNTY, NEW YORK (THE "TOWN"), AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION OF MACHINERY AND APPARATUS FOR USE BY THE TOWN; STATING THE MAXIMUM ESTIMATED COST THEREOF IS \$500,000; APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT THEREFOR; AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF UP TO \$500,000 IN SERIAL BONDS OF THE TOWN TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION".

2. Object or Purpose: the acquisition of machinery and apparatus for use by the Town's Highway Department consisting of (i) one (1) plow/salt truck, (ii) one roller, and (iii) one tractor.
