##### **Parks Update: Matt Beeman**

- Mowing has been a priority in the parks to keep the fields ready for athletic events.
- The Department is utilizing new equipment acquired through the 2024 CIP to do grass cuttings between the contracted mowings, so that the fields are kept in playable condition.
- Recent storms have necessitated tree clean up on our trail systems.
- The new Tree Nursery gate is to be installed the week of Memorial Day.
- Irrigation to the Tree Nursery (which is also accessible to the Community Garden) will be provided through the Water District serving the Community Garden.
- The connector trail from the Farm Market Barn to the Buckland House Parking Lot has been reconstructed in the low spots needing attention, thereby improving accessibility.
- Planning for our July 4th celebration is well underway.
- After a lengthy interview process (over 150 applications) the Department has filled the remaining full time position vacancy and we expect the new employee to start on June 9<sup>th</sup>.

### **Town of Brighton Annual Clean Sweep and Recycling Events Updates**

- Clean Sweep and Recycling events went very well
  - EWASTE + picked up a total ten pallets of electronics constituting 25,210 lbs. of electronics that were kept out of our waste stream.
  - ProShred picked up 13,020 lbs. of paper, which is equal to 6.51 tons of processed materials, and 33 cubic yards of waste saved.
  - We had over 100 volunteers from the community and another 75 volunteers through the BCSD participate in this year's Clean Sweep
  - We again thank our generous monetary and in-kind donors for Clean Sweep: including the Brighton Fire Department, Brighton Teachers' Association, Brighton Rotary, Brighton Volunteer Ambulance, Canandaigua National Bank, Mancuso Brightman, PC, the Office of NYS Assemblymember Sarah Clark, the office of NYS Senator Jeremy Cooney, Canandaigua National Bank, ESL, Roselawn Neighborhood Association, Transcontinental Properties, LLC, Bagel Land, Starbucks, Tops Friendly Markets, and Jersey Mike's. It's our donors and volunteers who have made this community event possible for the last 22 years, and we are truly in your debt.
