CONTINUING BUSINESS

Parks Update: Matt Beeman

- Discussion of 4th of July event, strong (similar to pre-COVID) participation numbers were reported for the 5K. Meridian Centre Park event went well. Increased number of food vendors was well received and kept lines manageable. Everything went smoothly.
 - Discussion of Buckland Park unscheduled activities being an area of concern during the 4th of July event.
 - Discussion of staffing, specifically with the need to split resources of police officers and park staff between Meridian and other parks
 - Discussion of ideas to make the bounce attractions more affordable for larger families, in particular.
 - Discussion of shade, given the higher temperatures of the past few years and the potential for some sort of hydration/cooling station/mister

- With 4th of July activities concluded and vegetation growth slowing somewhat, parks staff is shifting focus more to trail maintenance, particularly at Corbett's Glen, in the near term. Ongoing efforts to connect with CSX to address bridge and railing maintenance issues.
- Discussion of Brighton Town Park trail connector from parking lot to paved portion of the trail
- Park staffing and shifts have become more manageable, particularly with PTO requests, with the addition of a full-time laborer.
- Discussion of solar panel installations on various park buildings and better coordination, given special events, camps and rentals

Recreation Programs: Rebecca Cotter

- Camps are underway and going very well. We are fortunate again to have a strong staff this year. Flexibility is one of the hallmarks of our summer camp offerings, and there are still a few spaces remaining for last minute camper sign ups in our Preschool, Council Rock and TCMS Summer Playground Camp. Don't miss out, get your kids registered today!
- The Summer Concert Series is off to a great start, and we are looking forward to the remainder of the series—especially with the addition of a food vendor for the series!
- Brighton Community Bike Rides are going great! We had another strong showing in the July ride. The addition of interpreting services for welcoming remarks is a good addition to the program.
- Discussion of staffing – Specifically of the hiring and recruitment for Full Time Recreation Leader Position
- Discussion of the polling site at the Winter Farmer's Market Barn, particularly with regard to Early Voting and how it intersects with programming.
- Food cupboard/recycling events/promotion – Discussion of possibilities and possible alternate locations for the recycling events to move to due to traffic congestion related to these events
- Discussion of NYS BRICKS Grant kick off of earlier in the week. Notification of awards is November 1.
- Discussion of Feasibility Study and Community Center Needs Assessment Report and presentation.
- Alternate location for Summer 2026 Summer Farmers Market discussed

Farmers' Market/Community Garden/Tree Nursery Update

- Tree nursery update discussion: Additional spigot installed through the Community Garden for the tree nursery
- Coordination with the Parks and Highway Departments to get trees moved into parks and the community when they are big enough
- Discussion of tree ambassador program

Inclusion, Diversity and Equity Advisory Board Update: Miriam Moore

- Juneteenth and Pride Trivia with the Brighton Seniors programming went very well. Seniors were very engaged.
- Inclusive Summer Camp Training with the Recreation Department Staff was very well received and included conversations about making everyone feeling welcome and fostering a welcoming atmosphere in light of neurodiversity among campers

- Townwide Pride celebration and flag unfurling proceeded smoothly. As usual, it was a joyful event.
- Pride Parade on Saturday, July 19th. Town of Brighton contingent was strong.
- The Town Talk Series earlier in the year was successful, and will be looking to repeat it again in the 4th quarter. Discussion of topics is underway
- IDEA Board meeting this week, where the membership continued to discuss topics.
- Given the dire need, potential ongoing partnership with Rochester Refugee Resettlement was discussed

Sustainability Oversight Committee Update

- July meeting moved to Tuesday, July 22nd.
- Draft CIP is in process and will be the focus of the July meeting
- Looking at the site map for Town Hall and Monroe County and NYS DOT projects and determining best ways in which the Complete Streets Policy, Climate Action Plan, Bike/Walk Brighton Plan, and Comprehensive Plan goals can be achieved therein.
- Staying informed on the NYSERDA grant implementation of solar and geothermal projects
- Discussion of ICLEI Climate Communities and how it may be a means to keep abreast of additional grant opportunities, given the sunset of the current implementation of CEC grants through NYSERDA

Conservation Board Update

- Continue to promote the tree nursery and the Pollinator Pathway Project

- Discussion of soil testing to look at soil biology which will help to build a more resilient field
- Overseeding, aerating, topdressing with organic material to better equip the grass to outcompete the weeds
- More to follow, particularly with regard to invasive species management in the parks and along the trails
